Silas Brooks

On November 22, 1997 CLAS members placed a memorial marker on the public grave site of <u>Silas Brooks</u>. About 40 club members, Burlington's First Selectman, and other history buffs attended the service under a gray sky with rain and snow falling. The group that worked researching and getting the marker was Bill Colyer, Tony Roswell and Kathy Wadsworth. I remember many meetings devoted primarily to finalizing plans for the Silas Brooks memorial.

Ellen and I were asked to present some ballooning history to our local Cheshire Grange. While researching Silas Brooks I've come upon some tragic news. The cemetery we placed the plaque in has been vandalized. Silas Brooks was buried in a Seventh Day Baptist Cemetery. The cemetery has been mistakenly referred to Burlington Center Cemetery, but is best known as **Green Lady Cemetery**, due to a ghost that supposedly haunts the grounds.

You can pull up an excellent article on the internet written by Lawrence S. Carlton, M.D. in the HOG RIVER JOURNAL in the spring of 2008. He states, "With 187 known ascensions, this man is arguably Connecticut's foremost air traveler of the 19th century.

Brooks ended up a ward of the town of Burlington, living in the local poorhouse. He died in 1906 at the age of 82. The Courant obituary concludes: "The funeral Saturday was a pathetic scene - made pathetic by the thought that this man whose going out was of so little consequence except to a very few had once been really great in the eyes of many. It takes no

Prophet to predict that briars will soon overgrow Brooks' grave and that even the memory of his fame will be a forgotten story of the past." The prediction proved to be true until 1997 when CLAS came to the rescue.

PRESENT

The cemetery was vandalized in the 1970s and again during the overnight period of July 20 and the 21, 2010. The Connecticut state police are investigating the disappearance of the Elisabeth Palmiter headstone. The cemetery is now private property (owned by the New Britain Public Works) and the Burlington police and local residents usually patrol the area at night. Visiting the site during the day for the purpose of historical research is permitted.

Knowing about the many robberies of brass, copper, and bronze, Ellen and I took a ride this afternoon over to Upson Rd. in Burlington. It's sad to see the old cemetery minus all the headstones with just remnants of their original bases left. **The Silas Brooks memorial marker is gone!** There is only one large stone which lies flush to the surface engraved "*In memory of Mrs. AMY, wife of Mr. Michael Spencer who died April 12 1817 AE.50*" Nothing else left in the cemetery is engraved.

Suggest we, as members of CLAS, again look at the situation. Perhaps a plaque, next to the <u>Silas Brooks basket</u>, located in the Bradley Museum would stand the test of time. I think anything less than a large engraved stone at the cemetery would again be destroyed or stolen. We will notify the State Police of the missing Silas Brook plaque, but I'm certain that will just be another act of futility.

The mapping system is called Hunting GPS maps and for \$99, you can insert the microSD card in your Garmin GPS. It will then display a detailed map with landowner names and exact property boundaries. When I heard this I sat up and listened a bit more carefully as I could see this being a great tool for the chase team. I could use the technology in the basket as well but it would probably be more advantageous to the crew. Obviously it was designed with hunters in mind but has definite benefits for our industry. CLAS Meeting Minutes, February, 16th, 2012

This month we had an educational experience.

Joe & Janet Doerer from Whitehouse Station, NJ gave a talk and slide show about their experience with power lines. While flying 'Dream Chaser' at the St. John festival in Canada Joe encountered a power line. It was an evening flight and Joe experienced the low level jets that occur from time to time.

As all pilots are instructed to do, 'when in doubt, RIP OUT'. Well this was Joe's intent but he found that low level jet and could not 'fall' in time to miss the high tension wires. The uprights found the wire and they had a 'zip-line' ride until they encountered the upward angle of the power line. Joe was trying to shut off the pilot light, tanks and pull the red line all at the same time.

There was no spark or arcing upon contact with the wire so Joe could not be sure they were 'live'. But you always want to assume they are. Joe was able to contact Janet and crew to let them know that all was well. The basket was about 30 feet over a corn field, away from the road. One upright of the Balloonworks basket was already severed and in the time span the enveloped allowed the basket to slip closer the ground. Now, only 5 or 6 feet from the ground, Joe was able to undo the two remaining toggles and allow the basket to fall to the ground.

Emergency personal and equipment were on hand but not needed. The wind was in Joe's favor now. With every gust the envelope was gradually falling down off of the wires. At the end only the crown line was still draped over the wires. Five hours later the power company arrived and assured everyone the power was off and it was safe to pull the crown line down.

22,000 power customers were without power for the 5 hours. The passengers and pilot were okay. There was just minimal damage to the basket and envelope.
